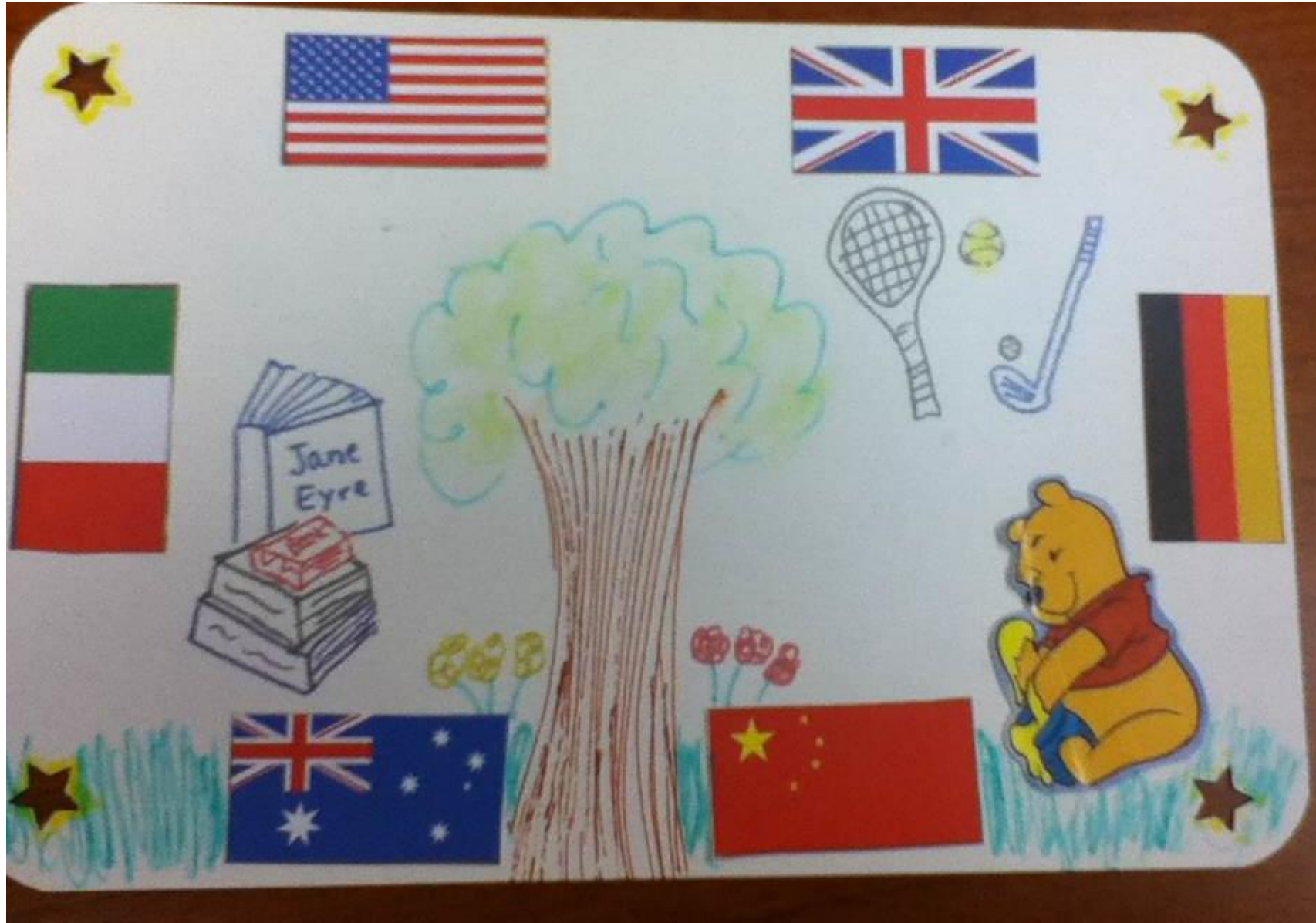

Direct Characterization

- Direct Characterization tells the audience what the personality of the character is.
- Examples:
 - Ms. Thomas was very greedy when she was a child.
 - Ms. Thomas is scared of snakes.

Indirect Characterization

- Indirect Characterization shows things that reveal the personality of a character. There are five different methods of indirect characterization:
 - Speech What does the character say? How does the character speak?
 - Thoughts What is revealed through the character's private thoughts and feelings?
 - Effect on other: What is revealed through the character's effect on other people? How do other characters feel or behave in reaction to the character?
 - Actions What does the character do? How does the character behave?
 - Looks What does the character look like? How does the character dress?

Indirect Characterization

- Ms. Thomas's little sister ate her cookie quickly, afraid that if Ms. Thomas came back soon, the cookie would be lost.
- When she stepped on a stick, she thought she heard a hiss and a rattling sound. Immediately, Ms. Thomas screamed and ran back up the path.
