- * two notecards must be summaries
- * two notecards must be paraphrases
- * you need to use each source at least once!
 - 2 database articles
 - 1 internet article
- other database or internet articles above the minimum requirement are great!

PARENTHETICAL CITATION

PARENTHETICAL CITATION

Each time you use information from your sources in your paper, you must provide a <u>parenthetical citation</u> indicating <u>which source that information came from</u>

Format:

Enclose a brief <u>reference</u> to the <u>source in parentheses</u> <u>at the end of the sentence</u> The reference usually consists of an <u>author's last name and page number</u>.

Note: every source will have a page number!

* You will use the physical page number of the printed out internet article as your page number!

What if there is no author?

What if the title of the article is really long?

"American Cat Addiction: Conquering the Fear"

3 BASIC TYPES OF NOTES

1) Direct Quotation

- -repeats the words of a source exactly
- quotation marks are used around the quoted material
- quotes should be short and should be something you can not say better yourself.
- only 10% of your paper should be other people's words.

2) Summary

- condenses main ideas expressed in a source
- says the same thing, but in fewer and different words.
- is over large chunks of text
- will be in bullet-point format
- does not need to be in complete sentences

3) Paraphrase

- your own rendition of essential information and ideas expressed by someone else, presented in a new form.
- a more detailed restatement than a summary, which focuses on main ideas.
- paraphrases are usually over 3-10 sentences of text (a paragraph)
- will make up the bulk of your research paper information

Physically separating oneself away from the cat is "imperative [because] it allows for the dark cloud of addiction to be lifted" (Smith 3).

SUMMARY

Strategies for Addiciton



Important to do:

- * physically separate oneself
- * limit play time
- * do not allow the cat to sleep with you
- * do not eat the cat's food

(Smith 3)

Main ideas from original source:

- * do not come into contact with the cat
- * reduce playful interaction
- * close your bedroom door
- * refrain from consuming cat food

5 Steps to Effective Paraphrasing

- 1) Reread the original passage until you understand its full meaning.
- 2) <u>Set the original aside</u>, and <u>write your paraphrase</u> on your notecard.
- 3) <u>Check your rendition</u> with the original to make sure that your version accurately expresses all the essential information in a new form.
- 4) If it is still too similar, replace words with synonyms.
- 5) <u>Use quotation marks</u> to identify any unique term or phraseology you have borrowed exactly from the source.

Paraphrased Version:

In research papers, students often quote excessively, failing to keep quoted material down to a desirable level-- 10% or less. Since the problem usually originates during note taking it is essential to minimize the material recorded verbatim.
